Retained by Lancashire on a new two year deal, **Jordan Clark** continues as a county contracted player, while a top-line overseas all-rounder from Brisbane is being lined up. Loic Gresty has stood down as groundsman

DIDSBURY plan interesting pre-season friendly games on the ground of Birmingham League club Redditch with a T20 followed by a 50 overs game next day, reports re-elected skipper Nick Anderson Newcomers are Matt Benton, an '180-day' player who has moved to the UK from South Africa; all-rounder Alu Raza from Cheetham Hill; Glastonbury batsman Josh Beal; all-rounder Tezz Balmer from Warrington; former Denbigh seam bowler Chris Willsden and Colin Van Staden, a fast bowler and mid order batsman from Pretoria as the Overseas. Patrick Moore, Andy Windle and James Hawley have all left the club.

MARPLE report many changes in a *Newsletter* issued by Press officer Mark Brook. apart from **Mark Bennett**, 23, becoming one of the club's youngest captains and Aussie all-rounder **Matt Whittaker** flying in from Victoria. Outstanding batsman **Paul Wood**, a Bredbury St. Mark's stalwart in recent seasons, will take up a top order spot; wicket-keeper **Mark Makin** moves from Hyde; Cheshire age group all-rounder **Elliott Young**, a high order batsman and left arm spinner moves from nearby Hawk Green. Another signing is **James Morgan**, a former colleague of Mark Bennett at Loughborough University, who has played for Yorkshire Under 19, Minor Counties for Lincolnshire and international national cricket for Spain!

Lancashire 'keeper joins Dabbers - and Cheshire

NANTWICH have acquired wicket-keeper **Gareth Cross**, who was released by Lancashire at the end of last season after nine years at Old Trafford . Cross, who played in the League for Bowdon in 2009 – and did well as a bowler – will replace **Jonny Kettle**, who is remaining in Australia after a season starring in grade cricket – and becoming engaged to be married. Cross has been registered by Cheshire and will be regularly available for Minor Counties cricket. Lancashire starlet **Liam Livingstone** is returning for a second season .

ALVANLEY's new skipper **Chris Charles** welcomes **John Suckley**, his former Malpas counterpart and Chester County Officers' all-rounder **Mike Rowlands**.

The picket fence has been extended and now reaches the pavilion.

MACCLESFIELD overseas star **Evan Gulbis** made history when he scored 229 and took 4-7 – including three wickets with his last four deliveries - to help Tasmania beat South Australia - coached by Darren Berry - in the Sheffield Shield. His tally was the highest on record for a number eight batsman in Oz first-class cricket and second only to Pakistan's Wasim Akram in the World first-class game. Batsman Nick Ross who scored 650 runs in 2013 is returning as 'the Overseas', this time as club captain. Nick enjoyed a successful winter with Carlton in Melbourne A grade cricket.

Nantwich's John Prince dies, aged 76



NANTWICH lost one of their most popular and long-standing members when John Prince died, aged 76 on Thursday, March 6 after a winter-long illness, with his wife Barbara and son Lee at his bedside,

A quality right hand batsman and off-spinner, John played for the club in the North Staffs & South Cheshire League through four decades against and alongside some World class professionals, the latter including club pro Sonny Ramadhin in 1970.

He became a member of the ground committee while still a player and was involved in the move to the cluib's present home in Whitehouse Lane in 1970. He became vice chairman, then chairman in 2000, holding the position for seven years. He assumed the demanding job as groundsman and took great pride in the condition of the pitch and square which greatly improved under his stewardship.

In accordance with his wishes, John was laid to rest in the cemetery which overlooks the ground in the company of many other former Nantwich CC stalwarts.

Death of Mark Hancock, 42

THE death has occurred aged 42 of former Bramhall player Mark Hancock, the son of David and Dehrne Hancock of Cheadle Hulme. Mark leaves a widow and five year-old child.

'Mersey lose nonogenarian Edgar Sawer

ONE of the best-loved personalities at Heaton Mersey, Edgar Sawer died after a short illness on Thursday, March 13. He was 92. A true gentleman in every sense, Edgar held every major office at Heaton Mersey where he became notable for his leadership both off the field and on it, captaining the club for many years as well as the Manchester Association and District Bank XIs.
