Hyde lead by 24 points as CBH lose again

LOSING their third game in the last five, reigning champions Chester Boughton Hall continue to forfeit ground in the **ECB Premier League** and have dropped to fourth place - 45 points behind runaway leaders Hyde - after their latest reverse at Urmston.

Chester bowlers took a mauling from Sumit Panda, 88 not out, Chris Turner, 83 (putting on 166 for the fifth wicket) and Adam Turrell, 47 in a mammoth tally of 254-5. Chester's reply was interrupted by rain, but they had a go with Lancashire's Jordan Clark (64) and the returning Jim Gillson (45) leading the way. But with teenage Staffordshire spinner Matthew Parkinson taking 5-55 they were bowled out 33 runs short at 221 with eight balls remaining. Urmston have now won three of their last four games after a bad start.

There's no shaking the consistency of Hyde as they continue to rack up the victories, their latest being by five wickets at Nantwich chasing a modest 153 by the Dabbers, Chris Tipping and Matthew Hanna doing the damage with 3-23 and 3-56 respectively. Skipper Danny Berry was not out on 72 when Hyde passed the finishing post at 154-5.

MARPLE GO SECOND

Plaudits to Marple whose upsurge sees them take second place following a seven wickets demolition of Neston at Bowden Lane. Neston, whose batsmen cannot get going this season, slumped to 24-6 after opting to bat first before Luke Camden, 37 and James Hawley, 23, raised the final tally to a modest 91. They had no answer to the wiles of veteran Andy Greasley, who took 4-22 off 16 accurate overs. Marple stuttered to 44-3, but won without further loss, with Paul Wood, 27 and skipper Mark Bennett, 22, both not out.

Grappenhall upped to third place thanks to a three wickets win at Alderley Edge where rain hung about most of the afternoon. Alan Day top-scored with 69 in Alderley's all out 175, John McClelland 3-35. Grappers made short work of that with a response of 176-7 in 35 overs, thanks to an unbeaten 64 from skipper Richard Green, and 45 from McClelland. Andy Windle took 4-54 for the losers.

If Neston are having their troubles, what about their Wirral neighbours Oxton who have to look back to August 31, 2013 for their last victory. They mustered only four batting points from a nine wickets home defeat at the hands of Bramhall after totalling a modest 169, Marc Debrabender 55, Simon Wilkinson 4-47, Vishal Tripathi 3-29. Tripathi turned in a fine performance with the bat after tea, his 83 in an unbroken second wicket partnership worth 165 with Matt Begbie, 81, helping Bramhall respond with 172-1 in just 34 overs.

The only batsman to score over 30 in the Toft v Bowdon game was England Under 19s all rounder Rob Jones, whose fine unbeaten 74 clinched a five wickets win for Toft. Visitors Bowdon suffered more batting misery with a below par tally of 115, Mark Phelan 30, Jimmy Lomas 3-6, debutant Jack Goode 3-9.

O There was a strange incident in this game when police entered the Toft ground and ordered play to be stopped until the driver was found of a car which had parked on the main road verge. It turned out to belong to one of the umpires!

Cheadle end Timperley run in Div 1

CHEADLE ended Timperley's unbeaten record since their promotion to **Division One** with a notable seven wickets victory over their title rivals in a rain ravaged game at Stockport road.

Timperley had an off day with bat and ball against a useful looking Cheadle side well led by Paul Sperring. They totalled only 113 against the fine swing bowling of Aussie Chris Moore, 5-22, helped by teenage left arm spinner Will Holmes' 3-32. Cheadle's reply was twice interrupted by rain which threatened to foil them, but it eased long enough for them to post 115-3, the impressive Dan Brown leading with an unbeaten 67.

Didsbury are 28 points behind in second place after a losing draw at Macclesfield, where rain also took chunks out of the game. Macc posted 233 led by skipper Nick Ross, 79, as Colin Van Staten took 4-46 and Simon Normanton 4-93. Didsbury reached 177-6 in a stop-start reply of 38 overs, Van Staten 58, Josh Bean 38.

Davenham lost ground when they went down by six wickets at Christleton, whose outstanding all rounder Ifti Naseer had a day to remember. He took 3-43 and helped Matthew Parkinson, 3-47 to dismiss Davenham for 144. Naseer then contributed a massive 89 to his side's reply of 145-4 inside 30 overs.

Oulton Park continued their rise up the ranks with an impressive six wickets win at Widnes after being set a decent target of 214-7, Luke McCoy 69, Danny Naughton 43, Guy Emmett 4-69. Tom Hyslop continued his remarkable run of big scores with an innings of 94 off 68 balls containing 15 fours and three sixes to lead his side home, alongside Pat Roberts, 40 not out.

Sale beat Middlewich by three wickets at Dane road after restricting their visitors to 141-9, Nick Gill 31, Ben Watkin 4-49. Tyrone Lawrence, 51, top-scored in Sale's response of 145-7.

Brooklands continue to seek their first win after losing by seven wickets at home to Cheadle Hulme. Put in to bat Brooklands mustered just 116 against unchanged seam bowling from John Burton, 5-49 and Rana Malook, 5-63 Jordan Potts' fine unbeaten knock of 73 clinched it for the Grove Park men after tea.

WEAVERHAM TOP DIVISION 2

WEAVERHAM are the new **Second Division** leaders after deposing Alvanley in a hard fought winning drawn game at Wallerscote road.

Weaverham tallied 250-4 without a score from Antiguan star Wilden Cornwall, their top batsmen being Steve Woods, 97 and century opening partner Alex Nash, 73 also Ian Eaton 53, while Lee Ainsworth took 3-65. Alvanley dug in to close on 160-8, Steve Gee 38, Stuart Hayes claiming 4-13 from 10 overs.

Promoted Northwich remain in third spot after being unable to dislodge Congleton's tail-lenders at Moss Farm. Mark Walker top-scored with 36 in Northwich's 142-9, John Copeland 4-41. The Bears replied with 115-8, their only iunform batsman Tom Blease contributing 44, while the consistent Sam Shepherd (37 wickets) claimed 4-44.

At the foot of the table these are trying days for Warrington, founder members in 1975 and Poynton, who have enjoyed unbroken league membership since 1981.

Poynton lost by 71 runs at home to Upton, who rattled up 170-9 despite a superb piece of unchanged bowling by England Disabled XI skipper Jimmy Williams, with 7-51 off 24 overs. Poynton were then all out for 99 against Gary Dixon, who claimed 6-47.

Stockport had the better of a drawn game against Warrington at Walton Lea after Josh Manning had scored a fine 105 out of a tally of 198-5. Warrington replied with 176-8, James Rudd 58.

Tattenhall also enjoyed a winning draw at Bredbury whom they outplayed, especially before tea when they walloped 221-9 declared in 49 overs, Ollie Thompson 89 and Roy Sandford enjoying a stand worth 109 for the seventh wicket Bredbury reached 144-9 in response (Chris Smith 44), their last pair holding out with his teenage son Rick acting as runner for injured dad Graham Barlow. Dave Shewring claimed 4-54 and Adam Brock 3-36.

Irby did their chances of survival a power of good with a five runs win at home to Heaton Mersey after batting first to post 178-7, David Newman 47. Heaton Mersey got to 173 when their last wicket fell, Rashid Amin 55. Greg Shillinglaw proving to be Irby's match-winner with splendid figures of 6-41.
