Hyde, Oxton, CBH lose as Macc go 27 points clear with 4 games left

MACCLESFIELD have not won the **ECB Premier League** title since 1999, but they are beginning to think this could their season again after Saturday's turn of events.

While Macclesfield were bowling Alderley Edge out for 79 to chalk up their ninth victory, three leading challengers, Oxton (at Neston), Hyde (at home to Nantwich) and Chester Boughton Hall (at Marple) all lost.

Skipper Barney Cutbill was delighted with his team's third win in a row which gives them a 27 points advantage at the top of the table. After slumping to 43-3, Rob Porter's fine 87, plus 46 from Khalid Sawas and a bright 30 from Macclesfield King's School batsman Andy Hodgson, helped them post 225-9.

Alderley Edge had no answer to the superb line and length of left arm seamer Craig Melrose, who took 7-19 off 14.2 overs to help bowl the visitors out for 79. And that after running up 303-5 against Hyde seven days earlier An unfortunate feature of this game was bad finger injuries to both wicket-keepers, Jim Melrose and Adam Worrall.

Skipper Cutbill learned over the week-end that Melrose needs an operation and is out for the season.

Unbeaten since June 2, Nantwich remain well in the hunt for their third successive title following a 19 runs win at Hyde after posting 214-7, Jonny Kettle 78. Hyde's county duo Danny Berry, 59 and James Duffy, 55 both did their stuff, but the remaining batsmen crumbled against fine bowling from Ollie Griffiths, who took 4-47 off 21 tight overs to dismiss the Werneth Low men for for 195.

Oxton lost their Wirral derby match at Neston by the even tighter margin of nine runs chasing 211-8, David Hurst 86, and John Creek, 52 enjoying a third wicket partnership of 127 before Ross Dixon claimed 5-29. With Lou Vincent blazing away, Oxton were on course, but when he was out for a fine 83 off 78 balls, the innings collapsed to 202 all out against the spin of Paul Stimson, 3-29 and the nagging seam of Chris Finegan, 3-42

On the season's driest day at Bowden Lane, Marple scored a tight, two wickets win against Chester Boghton Hall after restricting their visitors to 174-9, Kumar Sarna 39, Mark Rowland 30. The damage was done by Jimmy Ormond and Joe Cash, both 3-36 and Andy Greasley, 3-63. The Marple batsmen also struggled, but a sound 40 from Andy McGuinness, the highest individual score of the match, aided by James Crisall, 34 and Mark Bennett, 32, saw them home. That was despite fine spin bowling from teenagers Jack Williams, 6-82 and the promising Harry Killoran, celebrating his 15th birthday with 2-39.

4 wickets in 4 balls for Syddall

The remaining two games were between the four teams involved in the relegation issue and while Urmston and Didsbury emerged triumphant, nothing is yet settled.

Urmston kept Toft in bottom place with a 33 runs home victory highlighted by their Cheshire left arm paceman Adam Syddall taking 6-43, including four wickets in four balls, the first time the feat has been achieved in the Premier League. He and Matt Parkinson, 4-56 bowled Toft out for 155 (Andy Bones 51, Toby Drummond 41). This was in reply to Urmston's 187-9, Lewis Jackson 55, Callum Parkinson 50, Matt Parkinson 30, while England Under 15 leg spinner Robin Jones claimed 6-69 off 16 overs.

Didsbury won by four runs at Widnes to pick up 25 crucial points and stay outside the bottom two, despite a superb all-round individual performance from Widnes' Aussie Michael Nalesnyik. Didsbury were bowled out for 154, Phil Critchley 58, Nalesnyik taking 8-57 with 24 overs of accurate off-spin. Widnes were then dismissed for 151 after being 101-3 and 147-6. Nalesnyik did more than his bit with a fine innings of 80, but a 6-44 return by R. Nawaz proved the ultimate match-winner.

Veteran Dooler is Player of Month

A VETERAN of more than 20 seasons at Cheadle, seam bowler Dave Dooler has won the League's **Performance of the Month award for July.**

His superb return of 9-44 in Cheadle's 2nd XI Premier Division game against Nantwich at Kingsway on July 28 was rated by the League Cricket Committee as the best individual performance during the month.

He will be presented with a framed certificate provided by League sponsors Chapel Press and a £50 Canterbury sports voucher later in the season.

All over in Division 1?

WITH Oulton Park losing their first game since July 7 - by 58 runs at Bramhall - while Bowdon and Grappenhall registered decisive victories, the promotion issue could be all over bar the shouting in **Division One**

Bowdon 12th win was by 125 runs at the expense of Brooklands, whom they comprehensively outplayed at Georges Road. Bowdon declared after 48 overs on 232-3, Simon Marshall 79, Glen Parker 61, then dismissed Brooklands for 107, Marshall completing another good match with 4-31 and skipper Gareth Edwards 3-29.

Grappenhall returned to form after five blank games. They recorded a three wickets win against Cheadle Hulme at Broad lane, bowling well to restrict their visitors to 159-9, Jordan Potts 37, Gaz Burns 4-42, Steve Titchard 3-24. Then Jason Smith, 54 and James McCoy, 47 top-scored in Grappenhall's reply of 160-7, despite Ewan McCray bowling typically well for his 4-47.

Bramhall revival goes on

Oulton fell foul of the Big Bramhall Revival which has earned Nick Cantello's team 125 points from their last five outings. Bramhall totalled 222-9, Simon Wilkinson 64, then bowled Oulton out for 164, Nick James 64, while Simon Wilkinson rounded off a good day with 5-69. A word of praise for Park left arm quick Guy Emmett, whose 7-73 return in the Bramhall innings brought his tally of victims from the last three outings to 20. The mid-Cheshire club now lie 63 points behind second placed Grappenhall, with four games remaining.

Sale showed signs of a tardy recovery with a 47 runs win at Christleton after posting 205-7, Willem Lubbe 47, Dan Halkon 45, Matt Parkinson 4-34. Apart from Jamie Creek, 40 and number nine batsman Harry Peel, 40 not out, Christleton's usually strong line up collapsed to 158 all out, Rick Halkon 5-29.

Irby lost by seven wickets at Bredbury St. Mark's and may have a problem retaining their status in the final weeks. Greg Shillinglaw, 54 was the only batsman to shine in Irby's all out 124, Chris Wood 3-26, Graham Barlow 3-30. Bredbury replied with a solid 128 – 3, Darren Carr 47, Paul Wood 41.

The fixture between the bottom two clubs Heaton Mersey and Bollington was postponed by mutual agreement and with the league's approval and will be played at a later date.

Cheadle lead Division 2

WITH Middlewich losing their first game of the season at home to Warrington, Cheadle leap-frogged into top place in **Division 2** with a seven wickets win at Timperley.

With four games remaining, Cheadle have established a 12 points lead from which it will be difficult to dislodge them, although they have to visit Middlewich on the last day of the campaign.

Cheadle dismissed Timperley for 105, Mike Ness 33, with Chris Brady taking 4-7 and Matt Gross 3-28. Cheadle's Dan Brown, 37 and Nick Reid, 34 not out then knocked off the runs inside 30 overs. Middlewich's maiden defeat was at the hands of challengers Warrington and the promotion issue is now very much a three-club affair. Middlewich mustered only 138, Ron Cook-Sievwright 31, Kyle Adams 5-63. To which Warrington responded with a tight 139-8, Richard Heaney playing a skipper's innings of 43, aided by Mal Agar, 37. For Middlewich, Gavin Tomlinson, 4-39 and Stuart Price, 3-34 both bowled well. The day's only drawn game saw Poynton finish 10 – 7 points ahead of Stockport, who decided against chasing the home side's 185-9, Tom Berzins 81, Mark Green claiming a a splendid 6-25. An unbroken fifth wicket partnership between Tom Facer, 48 and Sam Edwards 31, took the Cale Green men as far as 141-5.

Key win for Georgians

Stockport Georgians did their chances of survival a power of good with a four wickets home win against Tattenhall, who had one of their off-days, being bowled out for 127, Tom Hyslop 33, Simon Normanton 6-40, Chris Dodd 3-27. Handy all-rounder Normanton top scored with an unbeaten 29 as Georgians replied with 128-6.

Likewise there was a useful 25 pointer for Upton who beat Alvanley by six wickets at Old Greasby road. Their visitors could muster only 125-8 from 50 overs, Andy Bennion 35, Graeme Keenan 3-28, a tally which Upton easily overhauled at 126-4, Graeme McGowan top scoring with 37 before retiring hurt. All four wickets were taken by former Lancashire player Andy Hayhurst for the personal concession of 28 runs. Malpas suffered their 13th defeat, by eight wickets at home to Congleton after mustering 145, Tom Crabb 38, and Colin Tinsley, 26 enjoying a decent stand worth 52 for the seventh wicket, while Jack Higginbotham took 3-32. An opening partnership of 131 between Adrian Dale, 71 and Marcus Baxendale, 56 not out, virtually saw Congleton home.

Third XI Sunday discipline must improve

SERIOUS concern was expressed by members at the August meeting of the League Cricket Committee about poor standards of behaviour in Sunday Third XI cricket.

Chairman David Humpage and Third XI Sunday results secretary Peter Lawson stressed that it was the responsibility of the captains to control the behaviour of their players at all times, especially in games umpired by players. Senior players should also actively help their captains in games where a majority of juniors were involved.

It was emphasised that sledging and abuse of the opposition is not an acceptable part of the game.

Clubs were reminded that in the event of a game being umpired by one non-player, that umpire should, if willing, umpire at both ends and he should not be replaced by players at the tea interval.

Discipline chairman Ian Greensmith was perturbed that there had been too many cases of team and individual indiscipline during the past month and called for an immediate improvement. He reported the following judgements: Mo Ali (Bollington 1st) suspended for three weeks for abuse of an umpire in a game against Bredbury St. Mark's on

C Hyde (Cheadle 3rd) suspended for three weeks for abuse of an opponent against Alderley Edge 3rd on July 22. Commenced on July 24.

- L. Little (Cheadle 3rd) suspended for six weeks for threatening behaviour in the same match v Alderley Edge on July 22. Commenced August 10.
- M. Rehman (Alderley Edge 3rd) suspended for six weeks for threatening behaviour in the above match v Cheadle 3rd on July .22. Commenced August 10.

Alderley had 10 points deducted for failing to complete the game against Cheadle 3rd and a further 10 points for their players entering the field of play.

- S. Sadler (Tattenhall 3rd) suspended for three weeks for playing under a false name against Urmston 3rd on July 22.
- S. Worley (Tattenhall) suspended for three weeks for signing the team sheet and submitting a false name in the same fixture.

The last two suspensions are subject to appeal and are deferred until the outcome of the appeal, as is a fine of £50 and a 10 points deduction for Tattenhall's involvement in those cases.

League format in 2013

- 3. If the decision is made to revert to the 2011 format, which of as number of listed modifications would the club support.

The replies will be collated and considered at the September meeting of the Cricket Committee with a detailed recommendation then framed to put before the November Management Committee.

Ground inspection delayed

THE League's planned visit to inspect the ground of promotion aspirants Davenham last Wednesday was postponed because of heavy rain. It will now take place on Wednesday this week.

Never before full members of the CCL, Davenham currently lie a clear second in the First Division of the Meller Braggins Cheshire League, not far behind leaders Weaverham, who were last members of the CCL in 1994. The Weaverham ground is also to be checked.

The Davenham ground was rejected last season because it was considered the square was below standard.

O MATCH REGULATION 28 has comes into effect. This states that no player may make his maiden 1st and 2nd XI appearance of the season for his club during the last five Saturdays unless he has already played in a game under the auspices of the League, including an Over 40s fixture (parent club only). Players need special permission to do this. The Cricket Committee have ruled that no transfers will be permitted between clubs in the league unless it is in order to play 3rd XI cricket.

The last five Saturdays are August 18, 25 and September 1,8 and 15.
