# It's a (virtual) wash - out

NOT a single game in the League's three divisions escaped the belt of relentless rain which enveloped the county on Saturday.

Two games were started and abandoned in the **ECB Premier League**; all six failed to start in **Division One** and all but two were cancelled outright in **Division Two**. Characteristically, the four games which began were all in Wirral, but even that normally Sahara-like region eventually succumbed to the weather.

So it was seven points all round from 18 games which compared to a total of just one cancelled in the entire 2013 season (Macclesfield v Toft on May 11) when the sun never seemed to stop shining, many batsmen managed 22 innings and run scoring was rampant.

Weatherwise, Saturday was statistically the League's worst day since June 23, 2007, the last time there was not a single game completed, in fact not a ball was delivered.

Team captains should note that umpires' marks are not required to be sent to coordinator Ken Spilsbury unless 25 overs have been bowled.

They should also bear in mind that result sheets **are** required for all games in which play takes place, including the names of every player taking part on either side.

#### **DOUBLE HEADER FINALE?**

WITH Saturday's complete programmes washed out, there is a move to relocate the entire fixture lists to Sunday, September 14, thus ending the season with a double header.

Cricket Committee members are currently being canvassed for their views on the practicality of such a proposal and wider consultation may be sought by chairman David Humpage before a decision is reached.

# 10 Years Ago
