

July 28 Newsletter: 2012 season

IT'S ANYBODY'S TITLE

RAIN, which has never been far away most weeks this season, foiled Hyde of almost certain victory – and top place in the **ECB Premier League** - at Toft while leaders Oxton were losing at Nantwich. Ironically Oxton pocketed more points (10) from this match than Hyde (7) and extended their fragile lead to seven points.

The title issue remains wide open and with seven weeks go, only 40 points separates the leaders from reigning champions Nantwich, at sixth

Toft were indebted to Josh Hancock for their tally of 209-8 at Booths Park, the Aussie opener carrying his bat for a fine 102, with Rob Jones (27) the next highest scorer. Hyde had reached 187-5 in 39.4 overs when a thunderstorm washed out further play, James Duffy 51, Chris Tipper 51 not out, Rob Jones 3-70. Oxton lost by four wickets at Nantwich despite posting 250, their highest tally of the summer. Top batsmen were Lou Vincent, 89 and Chris Davies, 52 who took the score from 18-2 to 160-3, while Dabbers' skipper Andy Newton, who consistently underbowls himself, just missed a hat-trick in a 3-32 return.

Louis Bentley played his best innings of the season in a reply of 254-6 with eight overs to spare, the talented Lancashire left-hander closing on 113 not out aided by number eight Jimmy Warrington with a rapid unbeaten 51, the pair putting on an unbroken 74 to clinch a notable victory.

Lou Vincent has landed a full-time contract two-year to play first-class cricket for Auckland in his native New Zealand and will therefore be ineligible to return to play in the league in 2013. A fine player and exceedingly nice bloke, Lou – and his bizarre caravan - will be missed around the county.

Last ball win for CBH

Unpredictable Chester Boughton Hall pocketed 25 points with a boundary four off the last ball of an engaging game at Alderley Edge, which keeps them well in the reckoning. Alderley totalled 219, with Alan Day,79 and Calum Rowe, 77 adding 160 for the second wicket, against Mark Rowlands' 5-41. Sound knocks in reply came from Steve Ogilby 51, Warren Goodwin 41 and Lee Dixon 35, but it took the bravery heart of teenage tailender Harry Killoran to strike a four off the final ball to seal it at 222-9, Zaymn Chapman claimed a best of the day 5-60 for the losers.

Macclesfield had to be content with seven abandonment points at Urmston after posting 151-8, Jack Ward and Craig Melrose both 39. Urmston had reached 117-6 with 35 of their 55 overs completed when the match was abandoned, Elliott Bullock 31 not out, Melrose 3-49.

A fine innings of 64 from skipper David Hurst was one of Neston's winning factors in a tight finish at Didsbury. Nick Anderson took 3-9 in the visitors' tally of 189 before Didsbury were bowled out for 172, Phil Slattery top-scoring with 58. Dave ('Call me Wilf') Jones, aged 57, made an unexpected first appearance of the season after retiring in 2003 with a Neston club record 1,043 wickets to his name. He turned up trumps yet again with 4-44 off 15.3 uncannily accurate overs (2 b & 2 lbw) and was proudly sporting his stiffness at Parkgate next day, while half-heartedly denying rumours of an extended comeback. Marple batted well and had the better (12 points to seven) of an abandoned match against Widnes at Beaconsfield road. Marple totalled 232-8 in the full 55 overs and Widnes had reached 163-6 from 47 when play was washed out by a heavy shower.

Neston win RedInsure T20

NESTON upset the form book when they beat holders Hyde to win the RedInsure T20 final by four wickets off the last ball of a thrilling game at Parkgate on Sunday.

Neston now go on to represent the League in the ECB t20 Area Finals at Mochdre next Sunday.

Close finishes in Division One

THE same rain played havoc with most games in the **First Division**, but Bowdon defied the elements to beat Irby in the last over, while Grappenhall lost by 10 runs at home to Bramhall and slipped eight points behind the new leaders.

At South Downs Road, Irby totalled 162-8, Rob Houghton 55, Adrian Kinsey 40 not out, Gareth Edwards 3-55. Bowdon's reply was cut by 14 overs and there were only four balls left when skipper Edwards cracked a match-winning four to reach 166-9. Mark Chilton returned to score 44, while Mark Newman claimed 4-33.

Bramhall's Aussie batsman Travis Dean collared the Grappenhall bowling to smite them for 108 at Broad Lane, Luke Smith's 45 helping his side amass 249-6, Jason Smith 3-70. Grappenhall had to contend with time off the field in their reply, but Luke McCoy made light of the conditions, his unbeaten 132 not being the highest divisional score of the campaign. Richard Green, 50 helped him in a century stand, but it was Simon Wilkinson, 6-104 who played the winning hand, bowling Grappenhall out for 239.

Impressive Cheadle Hulme

Cheadle Hulme notched up a notable five wickets win against Bredbury St. Mark's at Grove Park after their visitors had scored 213-7, Darren Carr 97 not out, Chris Wood 63, Phil Balderson 3-59. Skipper Adam Wilde, 71, played another good innings to lead a charge to victory with just one of a reduced number of 36 overs left, Balderson chipping in with 41 not out and Jordan Potts 43.

Christleton were too good for Heaton Mersey who scored 175-7 after opting to bat first at The Heatons, Pieter Vermeulen 91, Matt Parkinson 4-60. Ifti Naseer 78 and 53 not out from Iroshan de Silva helped the Little Heath men win by a comfortable eight wickets margin.

Oulton Park had the better (11 points to seven) of their visit to Sale, Rick Moore topping 600 runs for the season with a fine innings of 125, helped by Danny Leech, 53 and Pat Roberts, 52 in an impressive tally of 253-5. Sale reached 192-4 in a reply off 42 overs when rain halted play. Willen Lubbe, 99 again batted superbly

Middlewich 43 points clear

MIDDLEWICH recorded an important victory on a day when several of their **Second Division** promotion rivals faltered.

They won by four wickets against struggling Upton at Haddon Field, restricting their visitors to 170-8, Joel Huston 73, Gavin Tomlinson 3-40, Dylan Freigtag 3-44, then reaching 171-6 in the final over, James Williamson 57, James Cornford 42.

Cheadle stepped up to second spot with a 25-0 points demolition of Tattenhall at the Flacca. Tattenhall were bundled out for 94, Ollie Thompson 34, Paul Sperring 5-15 - including a spell of 5-0 in 5.2 overs - while Adam Wadsworth claimed 5-48. After Greg Dixon had been dismissed first ball, Dan Brown, 61 and Nick Reid, 35, sped their side to an early finish.

Aussie Adams first to 50 wickets

Warrington managed only seven points in a rain-ruined game against Stockport Georgians at Walton Lea. Georgians were bowled out for 164 by Aussie paceman Kyle Adams who became the first league bowler to top 50 wickets with an eye-catching 7-71. Warrington were allowed only 30 overs' reply by rain and had reached 145-7, Chris Kirby 35, Ifti Hussein 5-40.

Congleton lost by seven wickets at Alvanley, who have improved since former Lancashire star Andy Hayhurst became available. Congleton were dismissed for 134, Ryan Booth 43, Lee Ainsworth 5-35, Hayhurst 3-20, after which Alvanley coasted home at 138-3, William Speakman 59.

9 wickets for Tait, but Cheshire beaten

A FINE second innings knock of 125 not out by Cornwall's Taylor Williams killed hopes of a Cheshire victory in their **Minor Counties championship** match at Truro last week.

Bowlers were on top in the first innings, Cornwall being dismissed for 184, notably by Macclesfield paceman Ian Tait, with 6-52. Cheshire replied with a below par 168, Khalid Sawas, 73, being the only batsman to top 50 as seam bowler Sam Hockin struck repeatedly to claim 7-82.

With a lead of 16, Cornwall crowded on the runs in their second innings, Taylor Williams helping his side to a declared tally of 346-8. Tait again bowled well to take 3-76 and finish with match figures of 9-128.

Needing 362, Cheshire did better second time round with Jonny Kettle hitting 55, Danny Berry 41 and Lee Dixon 34 before Oxton's Ross Dixon, who entered the team at the last moment, came up with 63 off 45 balls which took the tally to 257, which was 105 runs short.
